A Note from Pastor Pase

Dear Fellow Ambassadors of Christ,

This month we once again begin our Lenten journey. Thinking about this brings to mind the words of Jesus in John 13:34-35: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Love is not an emotion. Love is an action as Jesus said in John 15:13 "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends."

As I think about what *our* love looks like I am reminded of the following words from St. Francis of Assisi. It is my prayer that throughout Lent and our entire baptismal life this prayer is lived through us. What fruit we will bear for our God doing so!

*Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace.
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;
Where there is doubt, faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
Where there is sadness, joy;*

*O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek
To be consoled as to console,
To be understood as to understand,
To be loved as to love,*

*For it is in the giving that we receive;
It is in the pardoning that we are pardoned;
It is in dying that we are born to eternal life.*

This is the life that we are called to live. It is the life of Christ Himself that is in us through our Baptism into His living Name. We are Christians. We bear the fruit of Christ, the fruit of Jesus. This is the fruit we call love!

God's Gift of Forgiveness

When we speak or preach about the Passion of Christ, we are speaking or preaching specifically about Christ's suffering and death for the forgiveness of sins. The penitential psalms provide an accessible way to preach about the need and result of Jesus' work *for* the forgiveness of sins. The word *penitence* or *penitential* is related to another very Lutheran word: *repentance*. What is repentance? Repentance is turning away from your sins and turning to Christ for forgiveness. Repentance, then, is ultimately a gift from God, because only God can turn the sinner's heart toward Him. Luther writes about Baptism in his Small Catechism:

What does such baptizing with water indicate?

It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

This process of contrition and repentance happens daily, not just once. Law and Gospel. Sin and forgiveness. This is the cycle of the Christian life. That is why Christians continue to repent and receive absolution. That is why Christians go to the Lord's Supper week after week. It is about living the Christian life, not simply knowing right answers.

This is what God is going to teach us this Lent – Easter resource drawn from the Penitential Psalms.

In doing some research for a course that I was taking, I was looking for a book in a university library. It suddenly dawned on me that I had the book in my personal library. But out of curiosity I decided to find the newer addition and compare it with the older addition which I had. Not only was the structure of the book different, so was the author's presentation and conclusion. In the thirty years that had transpired between the two editions the author had radically changed his understanding of the subject matter.

At another time, I was in the place where I did my banking. It's a small space at the front of a chain grocery store. You actually got to conduct business with a person, not an ATM. However, the person was on the other side of a solid wall and the interaction was via a pneumatic tube

and video monitor. As I approached my place in line, a woman was coming away from the monitor, incensed at the bank's use of technology. "I'm from New Jersey! This is Oklahoma for crying out loud. You people think we're rude!" she said, in a voice loud enough to give impact to her social commentary.

The daily events in our life are what causes us to "do" theology. They provide us with an opportunity to intentionally reflect on what's going on around us and in the world and ask, "I wonder what God says about all of this? I wonder what he is asking me to do about it."

To be sure, these are not easy questions!

I've only "heard" the voice of God in the movies, so when it comes to doing theology I usually have to act like Jacob and wrestle God for the answers. Sometimes my wrestling involves Scripture. Sometimes it involves my own or the actions of others. More times than not, I end up having to ask additional questions and engage in further struggles. And to confound things, what I discover in one instance doesn't always apply the next time round and so, the struggle continues.

Each of us by virtue of our baptism is called to "do" theology. We are called to do it daily. It involves more than finding "answers" to our questions. We are then called to act on those answers, for "faith without works is dead."

The joy in this is our wrestling with God. Our wrestling is his making an intimate connection to us. Wrestling his how God blesses us. Wrestling is how he uses us to bless the world.

Be a blessing, look around, ask important questions and let God wrestle with you and bless the world.

Graceful Living

How are you doing with your New Year resolutions? About the same as for other years? Can you even remember what those resolutions were? Why do we struggle so much with resolutions? Is it because they are not realistic? Is it because we try to do it completely on our own without any outside help (even from God)? Failure is one of the biggest disappointments in life. Is it possible to start over successfully?

As we enter into 2012, as we enter into every day, we have another opportunity to start over. Having the privilege of starting over is one of the things in life that gives us hope and courage as we look to the future. As we add pages to our planners, we really can start over.

In Paul's letter to the Romans, he tells us that the Holy Spirit gives us some great ingredients for a really good resolution. The encouragement is to "be joyful in hope, patient in affliction and faithful in prayer." Life would be so sweet if everyone could adopt and live out those three pieces as resolutions.

"Be joyful in hope" should be pretty easy for Christians because our hope is in Christ and "that hope will never disappoint us, because God has poured out His love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom He has given us." (Romans 5::5)

"Be patient in affliction" can be considerably more difficult because we do not like affliction. Who of us likes to be mistreated by people who are rude, inconsiderate and downright nasty? Where can we get the strength to be patient in affliction? It takes a giant transformation to behave so nicely when afflicted? Our comfort is that the power to do that does not come from within us, but from outside of us. When we were baptized "we were buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:4 NIV) No one in the history of mankind had to deal with as much affliction as Jesus, our Savior! And He did it out of love for us so that we do not have to fear eternal affliction!

"Faithful in prayer" keeps us in touch with God--Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus spent entire nights in prayer with His Father in heaven so that He would have the strength to carry out His mission of dying for sinners so that they might have the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. Prayer is an excellent way to stay in touch with God and His love and power.

How does this threefold resolution make a difference in our lives and the lives of those around us? It does because the Holy Spirit is at work within us to make us more and more the children of God. As children of God we seek to do the same things that give Him such delight. John 3:16 tells us that God delights in loving and giving. God has entrusted us with all of life and life's resources and desires that we manage them wisely according to His purposes. Loving and giving are at the heart of our Baptismal Journey!





Stewardship Corner

Bearing Fruit for Jesus

We just finished our January Stewardship Series: ***Bearing Fruit for Jesus: His Grace and Power at Work Within You.*** We hope you enjoyed learning more to bearing fruit with your Time, Talent, and Money.

Jesus said, *“Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me, and I in him, he bears much fruit; for apart from Me you can do nothing”* (John 15:4-5). Fruit characterizes the life of the Christian steward. It is interesting to note that, in this passage above, Jesus did not say, “You should bear fruit.” He stated that when we abide in Him, it follows naturally that we will bear fruit.

Paul explained to the Galatians what that fruit is: *“The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control.”* *“Since we live by the Spirit,”* Paul exhorted, *“let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other”* (Galatians 5:25-26). As children of God, we have this fruit because His Spirit lives in us. We do not bear fruit as a result of our own efforts, but we do cease to bear fruit when we give in to our sinful natures, becoming, in Paul’s words, *“conceited, provoking and envying each other”*.

Just as fruit needs light for its growth and maturation, so do Christians need to have their lives illumined by Christ. They then are able to produce spiritual fruit and shed that light on the world around them. Ephesians 5:11 cautions us to, *“Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness”* but to *“Live as children of light (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) and find out what pleases the Lord”* (Ephesians 5:8-9).

We discover God’s will through His word and through prayer. As Paul prayed for the Colossians, we, too, can ask God *“to fill [us] with the knowledge of His will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding . . . in order that [we] may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please Him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work . . .”* (Colossians 1:9-10).

God has plans and uses for our lives. When we abide in Christ, we will be fruitful. We will discover and follow His plan, and we will use the gifts He has given us in ministry to the people of the world.

MISSION STATEMENT: High Sky Children's Ranch is dedicated to healing abused children and promoting family wholeness.



TEN MOST ASKED QUESTIONS

How many kids do you have at High Sky?

We actually work with approximately 1,300 children and their families each year because of our in-home services as well as our residential homes. But, at any given time we have 45-50 children in our homes.

What ages do you take?

We take children, ages 0-17 years old, and we also work with the youth after they graduate from high school.

What types of kids do you work with?

The children and youth come from backgrounds of abuse, neglect and family conflict.

Where are your children from?

Our local children are from Midland and Odessa, and this region is our first priority. We will accept a few placed with us from out of the region because of program need.

Where do they go to school?

All the children ride the bus and go to public schools in our communities.

What is the average length of stay?

This is difficult to average when some youth are at High Sky for nine or ten years, in the Emergency Shelter for 30-90 days, and others may go through treatment in one year. Length of stay is based on need. The permanency laws require kids to have a permanent residence in 12 months. We also work with youth until age 25.

What happens to youth when they leave?

The youth either reunite with their family or relatives, move into foster care, live independently and some are adopted. After high school graduation, youth either attend college or vocational school or find employment. We have an after-care program for youth to help them transition to independent living.

Where do you get money and where is it spent?

We receive part of our funds from the state, based on services for youth. This is 75% of our budget. Gifts from foundations, trusts, corporations, and individuals total 7%, and interest totals 8%. The Crystal Ball, our annual black tie fundraiser, raises 7% of our budget and unsolicited is 3%. Our 2011 budget for all programs is \$4,556,791.86.

What is the future direction of High Sky?

High Sky Children's Ranch will continue to offer a continuum of care and services to include therapeutic Emergency Shelters, foster care, community foster care, in-home services, independent living programs and adoption services for the children and families that need us most. We will also continue to expand our outreach services, which focus on preventing child abuse and preserving the family unit.

News from the Endowment Committee



BAUMANN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Grace members planning to attend a four year college or university beginning in Fall, 2012, are encouraged to apply for financial aid from the Baumann Family Scholarship Fund. The institution involved must be accredited by an appropriate organization. The financial aid is \$1,000 per year, payable in two \$500 installments, for the Fall and Spring semesters. High school seniors and Midland College students are eligible for consideration.

Criteria for qualification consist of academic standing, involvement in Grace Congregation activities and financial need.

Application forms may be obtained from the church office. When completed, the forms should be returned to the church office - Attention: Endowments Committee.

It is emphasized that the financial aid is available only for students attending four year institutions and does not apply to Midland College students.

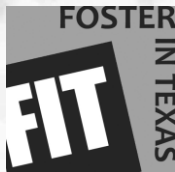
